FOCUS: PHE Canada is scaling the STOMP initiative to 50% of New Brunswick schools and expand the focus of the program to include all legal substances: alcohol, cannabis, commercial tobacco, and supplements. At the same time, the funding supports a comprehensive approach expanding the At My Best programs to include decision-making and leadership development.

GENERAL ACCOUNTABILITY: As Coordinator, Programs & Resources, you will assist with the scaling and expansion of these initiatives. Specifically, we are looking for someone to support:

Program Design

- Design student-centred learning experiences (e.g., design labs) aimed at preventing poly-substance use and minimizing related harms in elementary and secondary schools.
- Develop a train-the-trainer program with presentations, e-learning, and resources to equip facilitators with the knowledge, skills, and confidence to deliver the STOMP! and At My Best programs effectively.
- Develop a Student Leadership Program (expanding on current At My Best Action-for-Action resource) aimed at intermediate students.
- Design the Leaders Event for STOMP and for Student Leadership Program student participants, fostering active participation and meaningful learning for students.

Resource & Content Development

- Develop student-facing and educator-facing resources, including lesson materials, toolkits, digital and print content.
- Develop, adapt, and curate student-facing educational resources that develop leadership and decision-making skills.
- Contribute to the creation and maintenance of an online trainer hub, ensuring resources are accessible, current, and practical for program delivery.
- Support content development that reflects equity, inclusion, accessibility, Indigenous perspectives, and student voice.
- Support Passport for Life learning activity hub.

Facilitation and continuous support

- Deliver engaging and interactive sessions in both French and English, fostering inclusive, supportive, and participatory learning environments.
- Coordinate and facilitate the Leaders Event.
- Attend and support the At My Best Play Days.
- Provide ongoing training, coaching, and mentorship to educators.
- Create and foster a community of practice among facilitators to support shared learning, collaboration.

- Respond to inquiries from educators, schools, and partners in a timely, supportive, and empowering manner.
- Support Advisory Committee meetings.

Research and Knowledge Mobilization

- Assist with the collection of data from program participants.
- Assist with reporting on outcomes and deliverables for funders.
- Assist with the planning and delivery of the PHE National Conference in Fredericton, NB, in spring 2027.
- Create and present presentations on STOMP and At My Best.
- Create social media posts and content to share milestones.
- Support the other program team members as needed/requested.

- Post-secondary education in Education, Health Promotion, Physical and Health Education, Public Health, Kinesiology, Sport/Recreation Management, Social Sciences, or a related field.
- Additional training in substance use education, youth well-being, facilitation, or program management is considered an asset.
- Bilingual proficiency in English and French, with the ability to deliver presentations and training in both languages (oral and written).
- Strong group facilitation skills, including the ability to create inclusive, supportive, and participatory learning environments.
- Familiarity with online learning platforms, resource hubs, or learning management systems.
- Strong written communication skills, with the ability to translate complex topics into accessible, age-appropriate content.
