As Lead, Engagement & Knowledge Mobilization you will support PHE Canada's overall role in empowering the physical and health education sector. This position involves the development of impact projects, knowledge mobilization and carrying out tasks related to research for new resources, activities and to deepen our results equitably.

We are looking for someone to:

- Engage with educators and students on innovative, relevant and sustainable initiatives using a complex systems and Comprehensive School Health approach.
- Support research and evaluation work to support the advancement of physical and health education.
- Organize the development and implementation of PHE Canada government relations plans directed to support the Canadian K-12 educational system.
- Lead the development of engagement campaign, such as national awards, micro-granting, learning modules, publications, and policy briefs.
- Lead the development of membership supports and programs.
- Manage projects using project management tools to track program plans and work ensuring high level of accountability and collaboration with other internal and external team members.
- Assist with the construction of compelling and relevant briefs, blog posts and statements.
- In collaboration with team members, contribute to the development of grants and events.

QUALIFICATIONS

- Degree in a relevant discipline (e.g., education, social work, public policy, public health, communications).
- Three to five years of related experience with the social services or education system.
- Ability to develop understanding of complex system-wide issues (i.e., a "systems thinker").
- Experience building relationships with and facilitating multi-stakeholder groups to inform or implement effective practices, programs or policies (e.g., public health, research, education and decision makers, funders).
- Knowledge of relevant approaches and frameworks including (Comprehensive School Health, Equity Framework, Social Emotional Learning, etc.).
- Knowledge of the social determinants of health and an orientation towards social justice and equity.
- Enthusiastic and high-energy team player with a passion for engaging partners.
- Strong focus on critical thinking and strategic problem resolution.
- Bilingualism is essential.
