Student Survey: The Student Action Team developed student surveys to share out across the school community to better understand the prevalence of vaping and how to best address issues related to vaping.

STOMP Poster Development and Reveal Event: After creating posters about the harms of vaping for their school in partnership with a local company called "Sign Guys", the Student Action Team revealed the posters they created to Bob Montgomery from Blackburn News; a local radio/tv news outlet in the community.
