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
School Activities



STOMP Presentations/Junior High School Visit: The Westisle Composite High School Student Action Team travelled to M.E. Callaghan Intermediate School to speak to the students about tobacco/vape reduction. The Student Action Team created learning stations for students to engage in, and brought in a keynote speaker to give real world examples of the effects of vape products. The goal of the visit was to educate junior high students about the harmful effects of vape and tobacco products. They also educated middle school students on the statistics in PEI with respect to vape products. Using the STOMP Hub and local PEI statistics, the Student Action Team created the following knowledge products for this visit:

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Awareness Posters: The Student Action Team is also creating posters and infographics for their school, as well as for the schools they visit. The posters will share information about vape/tobacco use and ways to reduce/prevent usage.

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Advocating for Updated Curriculum: The Student Action Team is planning to reach out to the Department of Early Lifelong Learning and Education and advocate for an updated Health Education curriculum that identifies vape use and the harmful effects it has on youth. This work will begin in the fall of 2023.



Sustainability Plan

The STOMP program continues at Westisle Composite High School:

- The students intend on delivering 1-2 more Knowledge Fairs to additional middle and elementary schools across the region.
- Students are also going to explore advocating for curriculum change (see activity #3) to better educate and equip future students about the harmful effects of vaping as a way of upstream prevention.
